English Have you ever heard of Mr and Mrs Grinling? Well Y1, this term we will immerse ourselves into the story of 'The lighthouse keeper's lunch'. Using our talk for writing style, you will innovate the story using different characters and settings. You will then invent your own story in the style of the lighthouse keeper's lunch. You will also learn how to write a set of instructions on how to make your favourite sandwich.

You will be continuing on with your journey to becoming an independent and confident writer. Spelling misconception words and focusing on rereading your writing back. Does it make sense? Can I read it? Can somebody else read it? To change the meaning of certain words you will consolidate your learning of adding prefixes and suffixes to root words. You will be learning to use capital letters for names, places and days of the week. By the end of the term, you will be encouraged to use these capital letters in your own independent writing.

Author study

We will be studying the author of David and Ronda Armitage and we will be exploring the books they have written. We will create book reviews on the books we have read. We will discuss our favourite books by them and why they are our favourite.






Ronda and David Armitage

You will be introduced to multiplication and how to use simple arrays to help you solve multiplication sums in your 2s, 5s and 10 times tables. You will then build upon this learning by being introduced to division. You will learn how to make equal groups, share amounts equally and solve seaside word problems. How is the group of children going to share their buckets and spades equally? How are they going to share their sweets equally? This will then help you to move onto fractions. You will be introduced to halves and quarters by slowly building your skills to finding 1/2 and 1/4 of quantities. Towards the end of the term, you will go back to your place value focus and you will build upon your learning by looking at numbers to 100. Can you find out how many tens and ones are in a number? You will then finish the year confidently counting and writing numbers to and back from 100.
