Preschool Vacancies

Our preschool can take children in the term before they turn 3. We take admissions into the setting in September, January and April. Sessions for the spring term have been agreed with parents and we are now taking prospective bookings for the summer term and 2024/25 entry. For more details please contact the office.

Our Governors

A big thank you to our Local Governing Board. Our Team of governors meet every half term to help ensure our children are getting the very best. It is a voluntary role but it is very much appreciated by school and the Trust that this team give the time to the role and want to be involved in our school. Thank you! We currently have one vacancy for a foundation governor, if you are interested – please contact the office for further information and the relevant forms.

School Dinner Costs

We notified you earlier this half term that from 1^{st} January the cost of school meals is rising to £2.75 a day – whilst none of us like a rise in price, I am sure you can understand that catering costs have risen and there have been no price rises in the last few years.

School Payments

We thank families for keeping on top of any monies owed to school through using ParentPay.

Our extended school services are run as businesses outside of the school budget. They have to meet their running costs and any profit is used to enhance the services and school resources. We have to monitor non-payment of services and take action if outstanding payments reach a threshold. This will be defined as:

- £25 per child for school dinners debt or
- £75 per child for OOSC or
- Preschool invoice not paid within 4 weeks or
- Total debts to school services (Dinners/OOSC/Preschool) exceed £100 per child

Once the threshold has been reached, school will contact you regarding the outstanding payment. Non-payment towards services used could lead to the use of them being withdrawn for your child.

Please can you check your ParentPay accounts and settle any outstanding Autumn term payments in readiness for the new term. Thank you.

OOSC

Please ensure you have made your bookings, or confirmed your bookings are to continue with Clare for Spring term before/after school club sessions! All bookings for OOSC should be made through their email address, oosc@wybunburydelves.co.uk directly to Clare please. There is a limit on places at OOSC due to the size of the room. Thank you for all the positive comments about our Out of School Club provision and changes this term.

Income related free school meals (IRFSM)

You can claim free school meals for each child who attends school in Cheshire East if you receive one of these benefits:

- Universal Credit with no earned income or with net monthly earnings less than £616.67
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

We suggest you do make a claim for free school meals even if your child is in key stage 1 as the school can claim additional funding (pupil premium) for new equipment and resources. It would also allow you access to the Holiday Activities and Food Programme currently in place in Cheshire East.

You can apply for nursery-age children if they attend before and after lunch sessions at a local authority nursery school, nursery class or an Academy nursery if it has the same Ofsted number as the primary school – this includes us at Wybunbury Delves.

Attendance Matters – it has been big news in the media. School have to monitor attendance and will send out emails to those children who fall below 90% - this is 'attendance of concern'; below 85% is 'serious concerns'. Everyone who meets this threshold is discussed with Cheshire East termly. Without a good medical reason or documentation, children who fall into this category will not have absence for illness authorised. School attendance of 90-95% still means a significant amount of school is missing and needs to improve.

We ask that medical appointments are, as far as possible, made outside of school hours. If they cannot be arranged at this time, please provide school with a copy of the medical appointment letter for our records. If you take a sibling out of school to attend their brother/sister's appointment, this is an unauthorised absence as the appointment does not relate to them and should only happen if you genuinely have no alternative. Fixed Penalty Notices apply to all types of unauthorised absence, not just those accrued through holidays in term time. Holidays within term time cannot be authorised by school.

If 10 or more unauthorised absences (1 absence = $\frac{1}{2}$ day) are accrued over two consecutive terms then school will consult the LA on the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice. The cost of which is £60 per parent per child if paid within 21 days increasing to £120 per parent per child to be paid within 28 days if remains unpaid will be processed to Court for prosecution. These Fixed Penalty Notices have been introduced as part of the government's drive to improve attendance. Please see our attendance policy on the website.

Please do not phone your child in as ill if you have gone away on holiday or out for the day - the children do tell us where they have been or are going to go! If this happens we will record the absence as unauthorised holiday.

Fixed penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absences which are not holidays when the threshold of 10 sessions has been met.

Contact details It is vitally important we hold up to date contact information for you. We should have on record at least two emergency contacts who can attend school to collect your child. New addresses, phone numbers and email addresses need to be emailed to the office so that our systems can be updated.
