Understanding the World

- Past and present: Talk about family members, making links to when they were a baby, past events. Sequence events in their life. Changing of the months, identify there are 12 months in a year- identify their birthday month.
- People, Culture and Communities: Talk about members of their immediate family and community, naming and describing people who are familiar and important to them. Explore that families are different.
- The Natural World: Explore the changing weather and seasons, noting and recording the weather. Understand the effect of the changing season on the natural world by exploring natural materials and objects.
